Death of Col. D. M. Carter. On Tuesday night this gentleman expired at Baltimore, to which place he had gone some weeks since. His health had been feeble for a time past, and he was not long since at the point of death here. But he rallied and was able to go North, though at the time he left it was thought he would never return alive. The deceased gentleman was about 49 years of age. He was born in this city and lived; what was then the City Hotel, which stood where the government building now is, on Fayetteville street. He lived here until some 14 years of age, when his father removed to Hyde county. Soon after this he went to the University, and after passing the course of studies graduated with distinction in the year 1850.
