#### Indecent Haste.

It was a singular spectacle which was presented in the Senate yesterday, when the \$50,000 subsidy to the Fayetteville railroad which passed the House by a minority vote came up. The Senate which has been in session six weeks and has thought that time insufficient to abolish unnecessary clerks and servants and reduce salaries which were fixed at a time of a highly inflated curs rency, had postponed just a few minutes before, Senator Graham's bill to reduce salaries and fees for a week longer, but they were asked and urged under whip and spur to put this ap-

propriation of \$50,000 of public money on its immediate passage. Such is the infinite consideration some Senators have for the feelings of those who spend the public money and such

Senator Leach, of Davidson, who has been the bitter opponent from the first day of the session of every bill tending to relieve the public of any burden whatever was eager to put the bill immediately on its second reading. The bill amounts to a tax of 34 cents on every hundred dollars of taxable property in the State and s to raise money to pay off an indebt. ness said to have been contracted eight years allo by a railroad company and which is now dug up after its years of slumber and presented for the State to

Davidson county is doubtless wealthy and her citizens have no objection to the increase of taxes which Gen. Leach favors.
