The French Assembly.

Paris, Jan. 17 .- The Ministerial statement has generally produced an unfavorable impression. The Journal Des Debats re- lowed to perfect the motion. Bishop's grets that the Government did not employ more animated and cordial language. It says: "In reading their declaration one might believe nothing had happened in France for a long time, whereas only a week ago the Republic was established. The Republique Française says: "The Government must rely only upon the sig-nificance of their acts and the frankness of their attitude, as the declaration will be of no assistance to them."

The Dix Neuvieme Siecle says: "The Government spoke for twenty minutes without pronouncing a single word that they ought to have spoken. The language of the Ministry is not a new programme, but a simple exposition of the situation, or

a report of Parliamentary proceedings."

The "Pigaro says: "The Ministerial statement is a political testament which will not prevent the fall of the Cabinet." The Constitutionel, Gaulois and Soliel praise the Government programme.

The Rappel, Voltaire, Marsellaise and Revolution Française vehemently attack
