FORTY-FIFTH CONGRESS.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.-SENATE.-Mr. Spencer presented the joint resolutions of he Alabama Legislature favoring an appropriation for the removal of obstructions rom M bile Bay, and for the improvement of the navigation of various rivers in Alabama. Referred to the committee on com-

Mr. Withers of Virginia, presented the pention of the Catholic Young Men's National Union, protesting against the dis-crimination made by the U.S. Government in the appointment of Chaplains in the army and navy by which Catholic soldiers and seamen are deprived of the benefit of their religion, and in the appointment of Indian agents, whereby vast numbers of Indians who are Catholics are placed in charge of denominations in which they have no interest or confidence. Referred to the committee on privileges and elections. He also-presented the petition of Beverly H. Robertson for the removal of political disabilities.

House bill authorizing the issue of certificates of deposit in aid of the refunding of the public debt was taken up and after being amended so as to make the rate of interest four per cent., was passed. The bill directs the Treasury to issue in exchange for lawful money of the United States certificates of deposit of the denomination of ten dollars. The army appropriation bill was received

from the House and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

Senator McCreery addressed the Senate in favor of the transfer of the Indian Office from the Interior to the War Department. The Senate and galleries were crowded to excess during the delivery of his speech.

Mr. Garland gave notice that on Saturday he would move to take up the Texas Pacific Railroad bill.

The Senate confirmed Goodson M. Hoberts as postmaster at Asheville, North

House was principally engaged in discussing the legislative, executive and judicial appropriation bill. The House has made the sugar bill special order for Thursday, the 13th.

Foreign Affairs.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 10. - France will advise Greece not to insist upon the cession of Janinas. The Prince Dondonoff Korsakoff,

the Russian Governor of Bulgaria, and the Consuls of the Great Powers have left for Sofis to be present at the inauguration of the Bulgarian Government. It is believed there are differences in the

Cabinet which must cause the retirement of either Kheireddin Pasha, Grand Vizier, or Said Pasha, Minister of Justice. The Russian army in the Balkan Peninsula is suffering much from spotted typhus. Paris, February 10.-Pere Hyacinthe Loyson's old Catholic church was opened yesterday in a building formerly a theatre. The Bishops of Moray and two other Protestant Bishops were expected to assist at the dedication but circumstances prevented their attendance.

La France newspaper says M. DeLes s ps, constructor of the Suez Canal, is a prominent and acceptable candidate for the Governorship of Algeria.

The Times' dispatch from Calcutta says: Advices from all parts of Sciere of active operations are highly satisfactory, both as regards the political and military situation, and the condition of forts and supplies. Rain still holds off in the Northwest Provinces and the Punjaub. The harvest prospects are most gloomy. LONDON, Feb. 10. - Three of the largest ute factories in Forfarshire, Scotland, have closed, owing to the depression in trade. It is reported that four factories in Dundee will stop.

BORDRAUX, Feb. 10.-M. Delbecque, director of the mint, has been sentenced to six years imprisonment and 125,000 francs fine for embezzling 1,400,000 francs of bullion, which had been lodged in the mint by the Rothschilds. Delbecque substituted galvanized copper brass for the bullion which hs embezzled.

Congresssional Committees.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.-The committee of conference on the navy appropriation bill agreed upon their report this afternoon. The amount of difference between the two houses was \$85,000. The Senate surrendered \$75,000. The disagreement was thus compromised.

At a meeting of the House census com mittee to-day it was agreed to report favorably on Senate bill with amendments in sections where it differs from Representative Cox's (N. Y) bill. The two bills are substantially alike in all particulars, excepting as to the appointment of super-visors, the Senate bill fixing the same under the jurisdic ion of the Interior departmen, and Cox's bill places it in the same department, but authorizes the governors of the several States to nominate said officers.

The indications are that the bill as originally offered by Cox will become a law, except as to the source of appointments, which may be settled by confer-

Asks for Extension.

FALL RIVER, Feb. 10.-The American Print Works, one of the largest in the United States, has been compelled to ask or an extension on its notes. The capital CRAPES AC. stock is \$1,000,000; liabilities \$1,300,000. The last return of assets placed the figure at \$2,000,000. The notes have been protested, but outside banks and creditors have recently called in the loans, and Thomas J. Barden, treasurer, received notices yesterday that the loans maturing next week would not be renewed. This caused temporary suspension of payments.

The Cattle Trade.

LONDON, Feb. 10.-The report printed in New York that the British government have issued an order forbidding live cattle from the United States to land at ports of the Kingdom after the 28th inst., is incorrect. The government has issued no such order. On the contrary, they have inti-mated that unless the future arrivals prove the existence of disease it will take no steps towards interference with the cattle trade. At Liverpool the Mersey Dock Board have agreed to erect a lairage, and work has already been commenced.
