FORTY-SIXTH CONGRESS.

WASHINGTON, May 14.—SENATE.—Mr. Vest gave notice of his intention to introduce a bill proposing to organize the Indian Territory into a State, and providing for its admission into the Union. His resolution making inquiry as to whether any part of the Indian Territory had been purchased by the United States with a view of locating Indians or freedmen thereon was agreed to.
The Senate resumed the consideration of the legislative, executive and judicial appropriation bill.

WASHINGTON, May 14.—The House Committee on Revolutionary Pensions today agreed to report favorably on Mr. Hilditch's bill to prevent the withholding of pensions from pensioners under the act of March, 1878. The object of the bill is to prevent the withholding of pensions from those who have been restored to the pension roll and then dropped on the charge of disability.
Chairman Bruce has called a meeting of the select Senate committee on the Freedmen's Bank for next Tuesday, when the Commissioners in charge of the affairs of that insolvent institution will lay before the committee a detailed account of their management and personally respond to cogent inquiries. The committee intend to apply to the Senate at an early day for authority to sit during the recess, and also for sundry powers not explicitly conferred by the resolution under which the general investigation was originally ordered.

Mr. Beecher in Memphis.
NEW YORK, May 13.—A Memphis special says Henry Ward Beecher was greeted by an audience of 4,000 people at his lecture in the Exposition building last night. He was presented to the meeting by Mr. Keating, of the Appeal, and his lecture was frequently interrupted by applause.

St. Louis, May 14.—The officers of the steamboat companies having headquarters in this city, and the officers of steamers plying between here and New Orleans, deny having refused transportation to colored refugees whenever the latter had money to pay the passage. They also deny that there has been any general expression of opposition to the part of merchants and planters to withdraw patronage from the boats which carry emigrants. This has been done in a few instances, but this is not the general practice.

The Exodus.
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Richmond, Va., May 14.—In the United States Circuit Court today, a writ of habeas corpus in the miscegenation case of the negro Edmund Kinney and the white woman Mary Hall, now confined in the penitentiary for a violation of the Statute prohibiting the intermarriage of races, was refused by Judge Hughes on the ground that the United States Courts have no jurisdiction over questions of marriage.
