If, on the other hand, regard to the powers and duties of the Itational Board of Health, Dr. Billings, Vicetional Board of Health, Dr. Billings, Vicetresident of that organization, has addressed a letter to the Fanitary Council of the Mississippi Valley, which is substantially as follows:

First. It is the duty of the State and local health authorities, and not of the Na-tional Board of Health, to take the initia tive in adopting measures to prevent the spread of contagious diseases. The Na tional Board of Health has caused to be er Eagre, reports under date of July 12th printed and circulated certain recommendations, which indicate the minimum amount of precaution to be taken. The State or local authorities may in their discretion make more stringent rules than these suggested, but if they are too stringent, even to absolute non-intercouse, this Board has no right to interfere. It is only when the rules are inadequate that it can take legal action.

Second Although this board desires to do everything in its power to aid State and municipal organizations, it is not expected to do or pay for all work of prevention ; neither can it place money in the hands of local boards to be expended at the latter's discretion. It must know for what purpose the money is to be used The Secretary of the Treasury, however, has approved the special estimate of this board for funds to aid the health authorities of Memphis and the State of Tennessee, and prevent a spread of the fever to adjoining States, but the power of this board is very small compared with that of the local authorities. Finally, the letter concludes as follows:

"Don't let quarantine occupy the attention of your council to the exclusion of municipal cleanliness, which is the great object to be secured."

Dr. Turner, Secretary of the National Board of Health, furnishes the following summary of the Board's recommendations to Southern local organizations:-First. Les State or local Boards authori tatively accept the rules and regulations

of the National Board of Health. Second. Let them notify this Board that such acceptance is made and have the no tice properly authenticated and certified When these things have been done, if aid is needed, the local Board requiring it must specify the amount wanted and present with such specification an itemized schedule stating the objects to which it is to be applied, such as pay of inspectors, policemen, food, medical attendance, buildings for quarantine purposes, &c. Money can be furnished only in accordance with these conditions.
