The first train with refugees will leave this afternoon at 5 o'clock, The policy of the authorities to furnish rations only to those who are in camp will be strictly observed. All mail matter leaving this city is thoroughly disinfected under the personal supervision of inspecting officers of the National Board of Health. The weather continues sultry.

The Fever at New Orleans.

New ORLEANS, July 29.—There has been but one death from yellow fever in this city this year, that of a Spanish girl yesterday morning. The second case re-ported to the Board of Health was a two year old child of Dr. Moinegra, corner of Magazine and Washington streets, who is now convalescent. It is regarded as a doubtful case. The *Times* says its reporters visited yesterday every doubtful case known to the doctors. They express the opinion that none of them have yellow fever. It would be almost impossible for a case to escape the vigilance of the State Board of Health, the National Board of Authorities and the Santary Auxiliary Association officials, who know of no cases other than those before mentioned.
