Senator McNeill Says He did not Invoke Senatorial Courtesy.

Fayetteville, N. C., Jan. 27, 1903.
To the Editor: I take it for granted that in your editorial of yesterday on "Senatorial Courtesy" that you refer to myself and the Cumberland matter when you say that it was invoked by me to destroy a dispensary that should have been let alone. In this, my dear sir, you are very much in error. The question of a "Dispensary" or "No Dispensary" was finally, after 30 days of notice, left to a white primary of the voters of the county—a solution that was commended by you at the time and which is in line with your present views upon such matters.

I was, as Senator, honorably bound and pledged to abide by the result of this election whichever way it went, and it was in obedience to a majority of 29 to 1 against the Dispensary—that I advocated its abolishment and thereby gave to the people what they now have—by their own vote—prohibition.

My contention, as a Democrat, always has been that all such questions should be left to the people, and that a Democratic Legislature should not follow in the footsteps of the Pauc Legislature of '91 and put such institutions upon the people without their consent.

The final result in Cumberland is satisfactory to all parties, and should the question of a dispensary again be agitated, I venture the assertion that only a few so-called prohibitionists would vote for it.
