# RISE FOLLOWS DIP IN THE FIRST HOUR

Cotton Closes Four to Nine Points Higher.

### RUMOR OF A MAY CORNER

Spirited Strength and Activity With Which Stocks Open is not Maintained --- General Declines of a Point or More

### at the Closing.

(By the Associated Press.) New York, Feb. 10 .- Market for cotton continues strong generally with a fuller demand than sellers are meet-Print cloths are very firm but quiet.

NEW YORK COTTON.

New York, Feb. 10 .- The cotton market opened at a decline of 5 to 9 points under profit taking, disappointing cables and indications that today's port receipts would exceed those of last year. Just after the call values reached the low point of the session, and were then 7 to 10 points under the best of yesterday on the active options. With this level the bull leaders again supported "alues, May being in particularly active General leading to considerable talk of May corner and to predictions that the New York stock at present 160,000 bales would be reduced to much lower prices in the near future as a result of export engagements. Coincident with these rumors were heavy buying orders from the South, and various spot interests also were buying freely, mostly of May and this demand exerted a strengthening influence on the whole list. Around midday the market worked some 3 to points under the best of the session as a result of fresh selling by longs based or, expectations of an increased move ment, but this soon gave place to renewed strength. European interests were heavy buyers, and the spot situation was a factor in the afternoon strength. All the Southern spot market reported prices unchanged /to 1/8 higher, while local markets was 15 points higher at 9.50. The close was within a point or so of the best prices of the day, and net 4 to 3 points higher on all save August, September and October, which were unchanged to one point higher. Total sales of futures were estimated at 600,000

New Orleans, La., Feb. 10 .- The demand for spot cotton continues good, but the movement today was restricted by inclement weather, together with the fact that vesterday's heavy trading had in a measure cleared off the sample tables. Quotations advanced 1/8.

The future market opened from even points down, and an advance of 9 to 10 points immediately followed. This brought on a period of heavy realizing, and the figures quickly worked down four to nine points, after which renewed buying sent them up again some 5 to 7 points. ### STOCKS AND BONDS.

New York, Feb. 10 .- The spirited strength and activity with which the stock market opened today were not maintained and the tone of the market became gradually more reactionary and at last easy at general net declines running to a point or more in a few of the leading active stocks. The most prominent of these was Wabash preferred, in which so much of yesterday's strength and activity centered. This made the speculative sentiment peculiarly susceptible to the fact, which became very obvious this morning that there was very such selling going on of Wabash preerred under cover of the new strength which it was sought to develop elsewhere. The whole of the day was quite strictly technical and was little influenced by any of the day's news. The size of the individual orders in Rock Island, for which the accepted unit seemed to be 1,000 shares, gave an artificial aprearance to the movement in that stock to that it had little impression on sentinent when it was moved upward in facf the general reaction which took hold of the market during the course of the second hour. The support of Misscuri Pacific had no better success in restoring the tone of the market. The Atchisons were accorded their turn in the advance and among the specialties Amalgamated Copper, People's Gas Brooklyn Transit and American Smelting were conspicuous. Sterling Exchange entinued to advance and London to sell stocks here, but these factors were no more prominent than during yesterday's trong market. Call money continued asy and an advance in sterling at Paris ufficiently offset the rise here to keep gold exports beyond profitable limits. The Sub-Treasury took nearly \$1,500,000 from the banks on yesterday's operations wiping out the previous gain from that institution and establishing a net loss of \$442,000 since Friday. These figures aused some calculations to be made on another unfavorable bank statement for the week, but call loans were made at a lower average than yesterday and here was increasing ease in securing time loans. 
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
