TROOPS TO TURN RUSSIANS' RIGHT Landing Soldiers at New Chang and Pitsewo

The Japanese shells directed against the harbor are fired with remarkable accuracy. Recently a sick Chinaman, who was seen traveling in a sampan, was watched by the Russians who observed that following the discharge of each shell, he placed a handkerchief in his pocket and threw it into the left pocket, occasionally varying this movements, apparently thus signaling the landing places of the shells.
