Governor Glenn left for Statesville yesterday, where he will deliver the Memorial Day address at the patriotic exercises there today.

Mr. R. C. Lehman, of Norfolk, was here yesterday to see his brother, Buncombe Lehman, who is ill with appendicitis, but is now greatly improved.

In Police Justice's Court yesterday Will Hunt was fined \$2.35 for riding a bicycle on the sidewalk; John Riley was fined \$5.95 for an assault on Jno. Maxwell.

Judge A. C. Avery, of Morganton, and Col. Sol Gallert, of Rutherfordton, who were here of attendance on the Supreme court, left yesterday for their homes.

Messrs. Charles M. Busbee and L. C. Bagwell went to Goldsboro yesterday morning to attend the dedication of the Home for the Aged and Infirm Old Fellows.

Prof. J. B. Carlyle, of Wake Forest College, was here yesterday on his way to Thomasville, where he will deliver an address at the closing exercises of the graded school today.

Rev. Hight C. Moore and Mr. J. W. Bailey, of Raleigh; Rev. C. M. Rock and Rev. J. H. Booth, of Maxton, left yesterday for Chattanooga to attend the Southern Baptist Convention.

Several Raleigh boys, among them members of A. and M. College's first team, went to Wilson's Mills yesterday to assist a baseball aggregation in that town in playing Clayton's red-hot fire-eaters.

The executive committee of the State Hospital board were in session here last night, there being present Dr. W. H. Starch, of Maxton; Dr. L. J. Picot, of Littleton, and Mr. S. O. Middleton, of Hillsville.

Deputy Sheriff J. E. Davis, of Surry county, has delivered to the penitentiary John Campbell and William Hudson, both white boys of 14 and 15 years old, respectively, to serve three and five years for an attempt to wreck a train.

A revival will be held in Hillsboro Street Christian Church, beginning Sunday morning, May 20th. Rev. J. E. Rodman, of Fall River, Mass., will preach, and while here he will consider an offer of the pastorate of the church in Raleigh.

The trial of the case of Leo D. Hearty, administrator of Brinkley House, deceased, against the Seaboard Air Line Railway, was continued in Superior court yesterday. The suit of C. E. Mangum against the North Carolina Railroad was continued.

The council of State has authorized State Auditor Dixon to award the contract for laying granite pavements in the capital square. The work will be paid for by the penitentiary authorities who desire to keep the available convicts busy making brick.

Friends in the city and throughout the country will learn with regret that Mr. C. E. Ryan, of Portsmouth, general passenger agent of the Seaboard Air Line, is very ill with appendicitis. All will wish for this able railroad man and popular gentleman a speedy restoration to health.

Spencer, who died at the Soldiers Home several months ago and was buried in the Confederate cemetery, were taken up, and removed to Oxford, the former home of the deceased, where they were re-interred. Before the railroad was constructed Captain Spencer drove the coach between Oxford and Henderson.
