Cables Less Bullish Than Expected.

TRADING LIVENS UP

After the Opening Business in Cotton Becomes More Active and Prices Work Up to a Net Gain of Ten to Twelve Points.

(By the Associated Press.) New York, May 4.—The cotton market opened steady at a decline of one point on near months to an advance of three points, the decline being due to rather disappointing cables and less bullish week end figures than expected, while the market was favorably affected by covering of yesterday's sellers on the cold weather in the western belt and the prospect for unsettled conditions over the week end.
