TO IMPROVE WATERMELONS. Work of Dr. F. L. Stevens in Hybridization.

Dr. F. L. Stevens and Mr. F. G. Hall, of the Department of Plant Disease of the Agricultural Experiment tation, left yesterday morning to attend to the picking and sampling of ome five acrae of watermelons raised for exporimental purposes on land rented for this purpose near Auburn, the object being to develop by seed selection and hybridization a variety watermelous that will resist the melon wilt, a disease which is so seere that many hundred acres of land in North Carolina will no longer proluce melons.

A few years ago Prof. Stevens crossbred citrons and the Eden melon, making some hundreds of new varieties, hoping in some of these half breeds to secure varieties having the disease resistance of the citron and the edibility of the Eden.

The work now in progress is a continuation of these experiments. The hybrids are each year becoming more

resistant and of higher edibility. THE WATERMELON TRAIN.


