HONOR TO MR. JOHNSON.
 Virginia Merchants' Association Orders a Bridal Present and in Token of Appreciation.

Mr. Norman H. Johnson, General Counsel of the North Carolina Retail Merchants' Association, has again been elected General Counsel of the Virginia Retail Merchants' Association. In appreciation for past services rendered the Association, at its annual meeting last week adopted the following resolution: "Resolved, That President Utzinger be directed to purchase and present to Hon. Norman H. TO IMPROVE WATERMELONS.
 Work of Dr. F. L. Stevens in Hybridization.

Dr. F. L. Stevens and Mr. F. G. Hall, of the Department of Plant Disease of the Agricultural Experiment Station, left yesterday morning to attend to the picking and sampling of some five acres of watermelons raised for experimental purposes on land rented for this purpose near Auburn, the object being to develop by seed selection and hybridization a variety of watermelons that will resist the melon wilt, a disease which is so severe that many hundred acres of land in North Carolina will no longer produce melons.

The Southern Railway train, due to arrive in Raleigh from Goldsboro at 11:59 on Saturday night came in at about a quarter of three on Sunday morning. 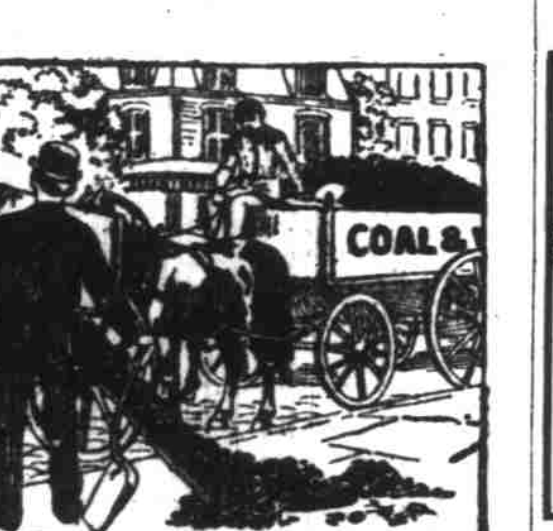

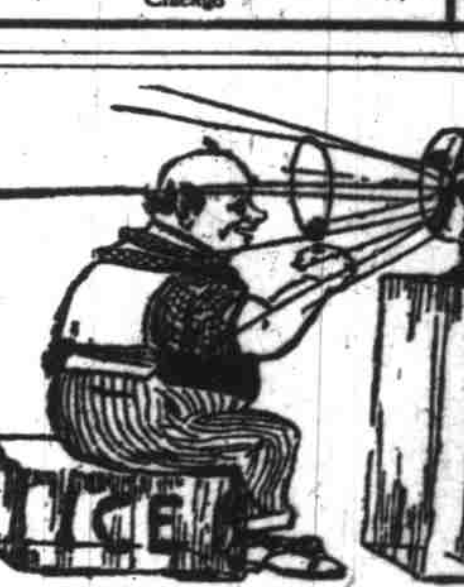

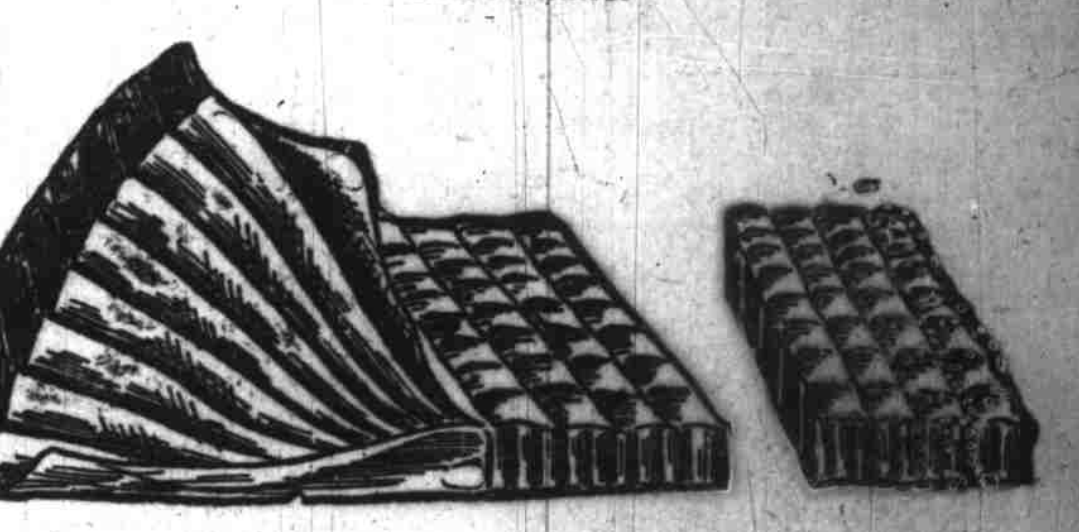
