IN AND ABOUT THE CITY.

After a hearing before U. S. Commissioner John Nichols on a charge of child seduction, W. H. Ray, a white man of the Falls neighborhood, was bound over to the Federal Court yesterday in the sum of \$100.

County Superintendent Z. V. Judd went out to Falls last night to make an address in the interest of local tax. A petition will be presented at the October meeting of the Board of Education for an election on the local tax question at Falls.

The Department of Labor and Printing reports that the manufacturers are responding this year more promptly than ever to the department's requests for information. The reports from textile manufacturers show that they are perfectly satisfied with the present child labor laws.

Prof. Roswell E. Flack went to Wake Forest yesterday afternoon to spend the Saturday and Sunday. He is an alumnus of Wake Forest College and has been elected private secretary to Congressman Crawford. Mr. Flack has been in Raleigh for several months pursuing a course in bookkeeping and stenography.

APPALACHIAN FOREST RESERVE

The Resolutions Adopted by the Public Meeting in Raleigh.

After the very interesting and instructive address by Dr. Will in Metropolitan Hall on Thursday night, on motion of Mr. Elliott, the following resolutions were adopted:

"Whereas, the forests of the South, containing, as they do, the most important stock of hardwood in the United States, constitute one of the chief resources not only of this section, but of the Nation; and

"Whereas, some of the chief industries of the South, notably manufacturing, are directly dependent through the media of water-power and electric power, upon the forests now growing upon Appalachian slopes; and

"Whereas, these forests are now rapidly being consumed and wasted; and

"Whereas, experience, both in our Western States and in European countries, has shown that the only adequate protection for mountain forests is found in governmental ownership and administration; therefore,

"Resolved, that Congress at its approaching session establish National Forests in the Southern Appalachian Mountains."

All words will be given from the "Blue Back" Speller. The prize winner will have an opportunity to spell against Mr. Allen, the state's champion speller, for the championship.
