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
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But After Making New Low Records

FIRM AT THE CLOSE

Prices Far Below the High Level of September—The Late Rally Induced

by Reduced Crop Estimates-Figures of the Census Report About as Expected.

(By the Associated Press.) New York, Oct. 25 .- The cotton market was very unsettled during today's session and after making new low records for the season had a sharp rally in the late trading. The close was firm, net unchanged to 12 points lower. Sales were estimated at 400,-000 bales.

The opening was barely steady at a net advance 9 to 16 points on covering and in sympathy with the higher A.C.L.45 85 Liverpool cables which were probably influenced by the better tone of the London stock market. Reports further difficulties in trust and bankng circles here and in New England, and private wires from the South predicting a stampede among holders in the western belt soon weakened the local market, and during the middle C. & O. 41/8 session prices showed a net loss of 19 to 22 points on active months under liquidation and bear pressure.
