Prices Far Below the High Level of September—The Late Rally Induced by Reduced Crop Estimates—Figures of the Census Report About as Expected.

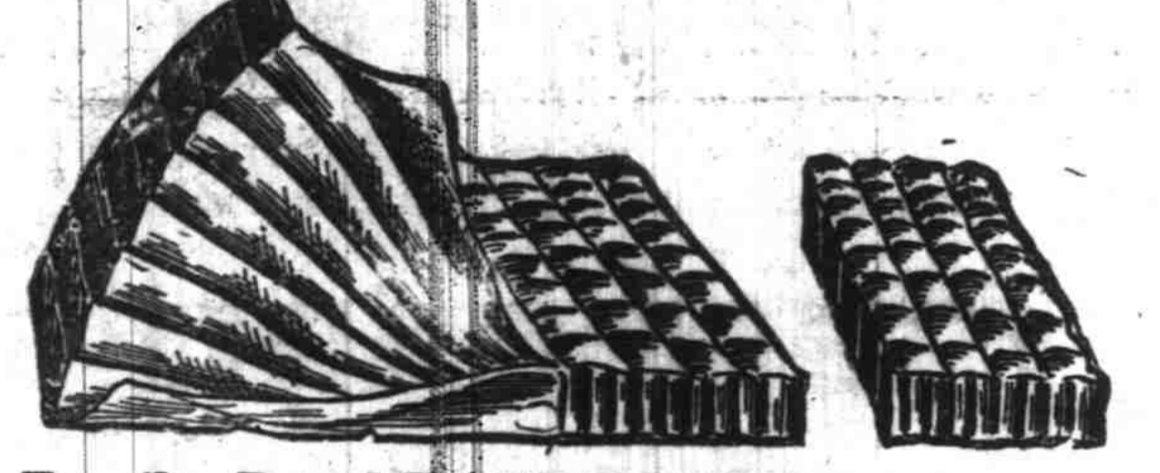
