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COTTON MARKET TURNING HIGHER

Bull Support After an Early Decline

SALES NOT SO LARGE

European Houses Bought on the Decline—Closing Figures a Little Under the Best for the Day—Southern Spot Markets Reported as Advancing.

There was a decline of four and eight points and during the early session the market sold off to a net loss of 9 points on the more active months under liquidation and local bear pressure which was encouraged by lower Liverpool cables and reports of suspensions in Southern banking circles.

There was buying by European houses at the decline, and around 10.04 for January. The market was steadier by covering with fresh offerings for short account restricted by weak end considerations and the absence of bearish news from Southern spot markets.

It was a holiday in New Orleans. A Liverpool crop report intimates the yield at 12,000,000 bales maximum. Receipts at the ports today, 59,451 bales against 57,919 last week and 5,068 last year.
