

IN HIS OWN CITY

Unprecedented Demonstration in Celebration of Washington's Birthday

Alexandria, Va., Feb. 22.—With the biggest demonstration of its history, Alexandria today celebrated the one hundredth and seventy-sixth anniversary of the birthday of her foremost citizen, George Washington.

The demonstration this afternoon was one of the largest and most impressive of the many that have taken place here, and it was witnessed by many thousands of the citizens of Washington and by residents of the surrounding country in Virginia and Maryland.

The events of the day were ushered in with blowing of whistles, and ringing of the bells at 7:00 a. m.

At noon whistles and bells again pealed a welcome to the visitors and announced that the celebration in honor of the father of his country was about to begin.

This morning a committee went to Mount Vernon and placed a handsome wreath on the tomb of Washington, a custom of the George Washington birthday association.

In connection with the celebration services of a patriotic character were held in Christ Protestant Episcopal church, under the auspices of Mount Vernon council, Daughters of the American Revolution.
