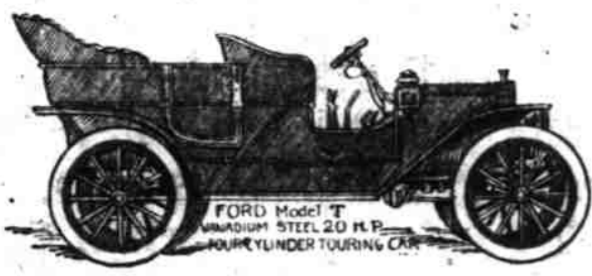

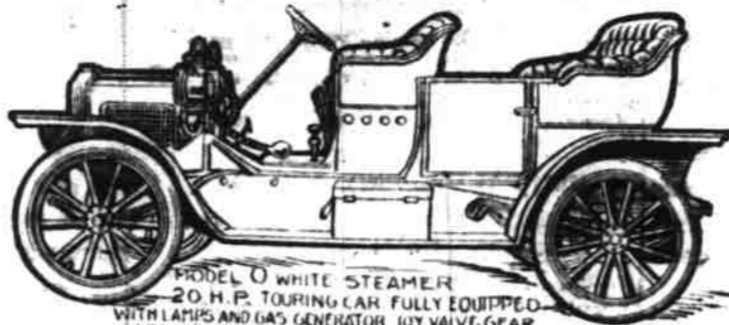

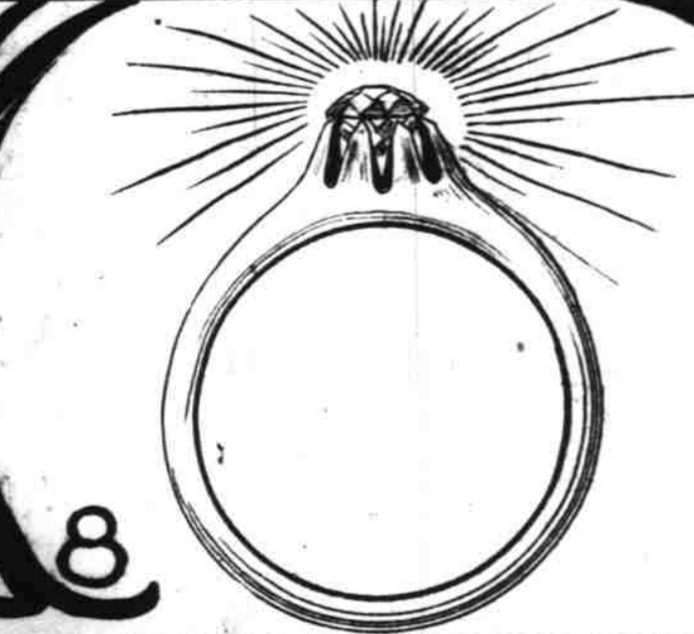

DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES

The judges of the result of this contest will be ruled by the following rules:
First State Grand Prize—The candidate securing the greatest number of votes in the entire contest, regardless of district, will be awarded the White Steamer, value \$2,000.
Second State Grand Prize—After the first state grand prize has been disposed of, the candidate having the next highest number of votes, regardless of district, will be awarded the Ford touring car, value \$850.
Third State Grand Prize—After the second state grand prize has been disposed of, the candidate having the next highest number of votes, regardless of district, will be awarded the Henry F. Miller Grand Piano, value \$750.
