

"Once for all I want to remove all fear that Jeffries and Johnson will not meet in the ring on July 4. There need be no cancellation of special trains or tickets. Those who intended coming to San Francisco can come as plauned and feel assured that they will see the fight."

The statement of Rickard was made soon after Southern Pacific officials advised the promoter that six special fight trains had been canceled during the day. Rickard was greatly agitated by this information and also over the fact that many orders are being received to cancet or resell fight sickets
