In regard to the petition of citizens to the Corporation Commission to have the Atlantic Coast Line train with a schedule from Norfolk to Goldsboro to extend this from Goldsboro to Wilmington, the Atlantic Coast Line has replied to the communication from the commission saying it does not think the train necessary.

The schedule, it says, would make the train leave Wilmington at 4:00 a. m. and return at 12:45 a. m. This, it declares, is impracticable, will not develop new travel, will entail additional expense, and will be operated at a loss.
