



## DETROIT WHIPS THE ATHLETICS

And Widens the Breach Between the Two American can Leaders

### LEAD OF CUBS INCREASED

**Chicago Defeats Brooklyn and Philadelphia Licks Cincinnati, While New York Loses to the Pirates—That Broke the Tie Between the Two Latter and the Phillies Are Now in Second Place—Scores and Features of the Game Played by the Two Major Leagues.**
