(By the Associated Press.) Washington D. C., April 3. - Dem-cratic leaders of the House Judiciary committee today agreed to report a bill relating to restraining orders and injunctions in accordance with the direction of the Democratic platform adopted at the Denver convention in

The bill would provide that no injunction, whether interlocutory or permanent, be issued by any Federal court without previous notice and an opportunity to be heard on behalf of the employed, with certain exceptions, I note: the terms of the bill it must appear to the matisfaction of the court from the condence shown that Imindiate of fregular trreparable inpary is likely to ensue to the com-platiant unless an injunction is issued authout notice, and if it be shown that damage might come before an injunc-tion be issued without notice, a tem invrary restraiging order without


