The finishing touches which give it all its substantiality, are being put upon the interior of the Edenton Street Methodist Sunday School building and Sunday April 28, it will be opened in all of its departments.

No such institution as this will be found in this or half a dozen States. It is true because they have not been built. And where the Akron art in Sunday School buildings has been tried the perfection of beauty has been reached if they essay to construct from the plain plan of this Congregation.

The public will find a quiet nest in rest in Edenton's church if it will take the trouble to see for itself. Edenton Street Methodists have done something that timid people could not have undertaken. Not a great many months ago the ladies boldly announced that they were going to have something worthier of their church than the Sunday School room in which they were then conducting their classes. They served notice on the men went to work raised \$10,000 and suddenly other anonymous besides furnished the enthusiasm that made certain this beautiful building. They have contributed perhaps \$6,000 towards this glorious accomplishment and it might be a pride to every Edenton man he be fond of free.

This structure is independent of the church. It comes up from an old one erected 35 years ago. While Edenton Street Church was going up, the congregation worshipped in the Sunday School room. While the Sunday School room was being built the old church was being used. It is now a complete plant worth more than the Edenton equipped with the latest fashion and designed to seat easily 800 children. In the meantime of things the school is so large that it almost demands that space now. There are places in which several hundred more may be handled but there are chairs set for as many as 800 now.

In pure statistics alone the building is an interesting institution. It has been stocked with beautiful folding chairs made in open style, particularly designed for convenience when there is a reception to be held in the large auditorium. In the gallery there is a circle of glass doors which close, fashion splendid rooms for reception and which opened furnish an unobstructed and perfect view of the rostrum. There is a room back under the towers, and both the Philanthropies and Parcels have splendid spaces devoted to their classes. The ladies have a pretty parlor of theirs and the primary class is cozily arranged for its instruction.

### Perfect Adaptation

## WITNESS STRIPPED

Show in Open Court to Allow  
Jury Chance to See What  
Actual Damages Have Been  
Done By Injuries

The women were asked to retire from the court yesterday when J. A. Tamm was stripped for an examination before the jury to show what injuries he had sustained in the employment of the North Southern Company in August of 1910.

An unusual thing was this but it gave the jury an opportunity to see the measurements upon which Mr. Tamm based his claim of damages just what was found but to be told now while the case is undecided.

This action took up the day of Mr. Tamm was injured in August of 1910 while serving the company as car inspector. In some way or other on horse street, he became entangled in the horse and was severely hurt. The plaintiff deposed that he was once overthrown by fault of his own, that the company is responsible. The North Southern takes the view that there was ample warning given Tamm and that he did not exercise caution.

He is suing for \$2,000 damages and Messrs. Jones and Jones and R. W. Winston are representing him. Mr. R. N. Stinson is counsel for the railroad. This is one of the interesting litigations of this court. The examination of the injured man in open court was unusual procedure, but the most interesting way to do what the court wanted done.

The first case heard had not been settled yesterday afternoon and the attorneys did not have the luck of clearing yesterday's docket as they did Monday's. The present litigation will be settled today in all probability.

## TRAVEL IN PAIRS

Many Recommendations for Laws  
in Regard to Ships Are Being  
Received by President Taft.

(By the Associated Press)

Washington, April 22.—Many suggestions for laws and safeguards to protect life on the ocean are being received by President Taft from every section of the country. The President is sending these to Secretary Nagel of the Department of Commerce and Labor, for consideration. Ultimately the information and advice they contain may be laid before Congress.

The general recommendations is that vessels be compelled to travel across the ocean in pairs and always within communicating distance. This can be accomplished in large measure. One complication is that compelling steamships on common voyages sail at approximately the same time.

Instead of sending warships to Guantanamo each year to fire at tars get and destroy imaginary enemies, one writer advised that they be despatched to mid-ocean to demolish icebergs.

The other communications recommended adequate number of lifeboats for all on board; emergency drift boats for passengers and crews; wireless operator always on duty; powerful searchlights; and a patrol of the ocean for the location and destruction of icebergs.

ON MADEIRA'S  
TRUSTED FRIENDS ARRESTED.

Mexican Police in Arresting Alfredo Dominguez Frustrated a Plot.

Mexico City, April 22.—With the arrest early today of Alfredo Robles Dominguez, formerly one of Madeira's trusted lieutenants, the secret police assert that plot against the government in which various locally prominent individuals were concerned, has been frustrated. One of the objects which the conspirators are alleged to have had in view was the assassination of the present ruler. The police have not divulged the identity of others who are said to have been concerned.

Robles Dominguez was treasurer for the Madero revolutionists and was imprisoned by President Diaz for several months for activity in the cause. Later he was put in charge of the Madero forces in the Federal district by Madero.

bers, but today it has narrowed down to two members by the death of Mr. William B. Royster, the snare drummer, who answered the final call last night.

Mr. Royster succumbed last night at 11:15 o'clock to an attack of asthma, while seated in a chair at the Soldiers' Home.

He was sixty-nine years of age and had only been in the home about six months. He was a member of the 56th Regiment and during the war between the States was in more battles than probably any other living veteran. By trade he was a printer.

He is survived by a sister, Mrs. A. Haynes and one brother, Mr. B. D. Royster, both of this city. Another brother, Mr. Len. Royster, died several weeks ago.

Mr. Royster, as a member of the only existing Confederate Drum Corps, the members now being Weller T. Johnson and James J. Lewis, was known especially in those cities where he attended Confederate reunions. He was preparing to go to Macon, Ga., with the members to attend reunion this year.
