M., for the purchase of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars of Wayne County Drainage District bonds to be issued in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina Public Acts of 1905, as amended by Public Laws of 1911, bearing interest at 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, said bonds payable in ten (10) equal installments the first installment of principal to be due and shall mature at the expiration of three (3) years from date of issue and one (1) installment for each succeeding year for nine (9) additional years, to be issued in denominations to suit the purchaser, and payable at such time and place as may be designated by purchase upon acceptance of bid.
