the people. Giving to the people the sacred right of petition, referring to them all matters not expressly delegated by them to a tribunal of their own choosing, and demanding of all officers the written evidence of their law and respecting the right to proper redress and procedure to punish or pacify those who failed to discharge their duties or to any corruption in the discharge, was, I believe, one of the best contributions of the Jefferson Standard to the State. That they refused to stand with the administration and unconstitutionality, under their one term and long service, of their worth and honouring for their leader that march under their standard, and stainless citizen Charles H. Hadley, Avocet, more than drove off the negro and disgrace would introduce education, progress and morality.

If you will read the old geography of North Carolina you will find the under Republican influence there was only one important question asked about North Carolina and that read "What is North Carolina principally noted for?" and the answer was "Farmland and timber."

What Democrats Have Done. Now the administration under Aycock administration and those following after him, and you will find my record. We have taken the first place as a State in the manufacture of plug and smoking tobacco. The second place in the manufacture of cotton goods, passing every State except Massachusetts. The second place in the manufacture of furniture, passing every State but Michigan. Two railroads have been completed to the last mile, at the same time that the other three, built by the Democratic party, were left incomplete. School houses have increased at the rate of one each day for every day under three administrations, and North Carolina is recognized every where as a State that is standing for the education of its youth. Over the entire country we are honored as the one State above every other State that enforces its laws, and we are held up as a pattern, for our sense of society, morality, and true religion.

Thus North Carolina under Democratic rule has forced to the front, as one of the foremost, if not the foremost, State in the entire South.

With such a record then for the education of its children, the development of its agricultural resources, the protection of its manufacturing interests, as well as for the high standard it takes for that elevates and makes man truer and stronger shall we again go backward? Shall we again allow ignorance and lawlessness, drunkenness and crime to prevail? Shall we re-instate a party in power that caused our independence, denied our children education, and refused comfort to our needs and affliction? God forbid!

So progressive indeed has been the Democratic party during the last few years, there is little left for us to do but to reaffirm what we have done, and go forward with the work commenced, taking no backward step as to the development of the State materially and morally.

I have already stated that we are looked upon as one of the most progressive States in the South, and wherever I have been, I have heard it frequently prophesied that on account of our location, our climate, our water power, and the character of our people, we would in a few years rank with Massachusetts and Michigan in the manufacture of cotton goods and furniture.

In 1898, dissatisfied with the management of national affairs, by a com-

mittee of citizens of this State, the State and the several progressive organizations, and we were given a chance to prove our right to self-government, and to show the world that the Southern people were not to be trifled with, we put forward our cause, there is no doubt in this paper, that such a movement

The second thing that I recommend is a mark of progress, and which is an important influence. I hope will be placed in our platform, the immediate endorsement of the building of good roads throughout the entire State. Mind before this heavy load that the people have to bear, while good roads, by shortening distances, dispensing with mail, saving wear and tear on vehicles and teams, in reducing the amount that can be hauled at a load, assisting in the raising of farm lands, and bringing to the market the best choice of our countrymen, friendly rivalry, the rise of the greatest and most permanent blessing we can give to our people. Fortunately, therefore, I am at the anti-Slavery and national level, to good roads, and upon this basis, the Democratic party, as the party of anti-slavery, to encourage and aid in every respect the efforts now being made for good highways through our entire Commonwealth.

Our Duty Ahead. Our duty before us is, as a party that has a pride that State known throughout the world, let us measure up to the responsibility resting at this time, in the upholding of our institutions. Let there be no uncertainty in the minds of the people, let us make clear to the world, that the power and prestige we have acquired both at home and abroad.

In State affairs let us reaffirm our unshakable intention to stand for those that go to the front, toward the upholding of the social, material and moral growth of our State, encouraging every effort to promote industry, thrift, and enterprise, and destroying all attempts to subvert crime, drunkenness and wrong, in the place of law, order and progress.

Can Be No Defeat.

With the confidence of a united people behind us, and the blessings of God overshadowing us, because of our moral tone of right, there can be no defeat for Democracy in this State.

capita than any other State in the Union, and the increase of her government and state, and this was the result of a successful campaign in the name of freedom.
