Kingston, June 13.—The manager of a picture show at Kingston, N. C., was injured while defending his negro servant from the attack of a mob of whites. The negro, named John Bond, was taken to the hospital and is recovering from his wounds. The mob consisted of several hundred whites, who were attracted to the picture show by the presence of the negro. The manager, who was a white man, was seen to be in a physical struggle with the negro, and was then attacked by the mob. The scene was a chaotic one, and the manager was severely injured. The negro was also injured, but his wounds were not as serious as those of the manager. BANK LOANS TRACED

Pajo Committee Tries to Show That Government Money Was Loaned to Stock Exchange to Control the 1907

(By the Associated Press) New York, June 13.—The Pajo committee today announced that it had found evidence that the government was used to control the 1907 stock market. The committee, which is headed by Senator Pajo, has been investigating the activities of the stock exchange during the panic of 1907. It has found that the government had loaned money to the stock exchange, and that this money was used to buy up the stock of the exchange, thereby preventing a collapse.
