No Special Term of Edgemont Court.—The order for a special term of Edgemont county court for August 10, to try the two negro youths charged with criminal assault on Miss Draughtidge, was recalled yesterday by the governor on the request of the Edgemont county authorities. The trial will be had at the regular term of court, which convenes the first part of September.

New Ice Plant in Operation.—With the completion of the new ice plant at Edgemont, the plant began to turn out its product Sunday morning. Raleigh now has five plants with a daily capacity of about 100 tons. The new plant is located near the old Edgemont plant at the end of Fayetteville street on the Southern Railway. It has a capacity of 35 tons daily. The water used is from artesian wells.

Front Being Cleared Up.—The front of the new Federal building is being cleared up preparatory to the laying of the paving. The walls protecting the work will not be taken down yet. The removal from the temporary building to the new quarters will be made about November 1. The post-office department will be moved on the Sunday nearest that date, so as to interfere as little as possible with the work of the department.
