## CALDWELL DEMOCRATS TO HOLD CONVENTION

Will Meet in Lenoir September 7 To Name County Officers

Lenoir, Aug. 17.—County Chairman W. C. Moore, Jr., has invited his colleagues to the Democrats of Caldwell to meet in county convention Monday, September 7, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the various offices of the county. All the present officers, Sheriff, Tripplett, Register of Deeds Crisp, County Treasurer Steele, and Clerk of Court Moore, are candidates to succeed themselves, and at present it seems that they are going to the convention without any opposition. Messrs. Moore and Steele are to be reelected, according to their first term, Sheriff Tripplett having served his expired term of Sheriff's card, who resigned about one year ago, while Mr. Crisp has served two terms as register of deeds.

It is understood that Dr. A. A. Kent will be a candidate before the convention for the legislature. Dr. Kent served in the Legislature of 1911 and was the champion of several important measures.

The Republicans have been called to the convention Tuesday, August 18, for the election of delegates to the State, judicial, congressional and senatorial conventions. This convention will be composed of Taft Republicans, Roosevelt Republicans and Progressives.

The Republican county convention to nominate candidates for the various offices will likely be called to meet about the 15th of September.

## NORMAL CONDITIONS FURTHER MANIFESTED IN FINANCIAL SITUATION
