Wake Forest Celebrates Victory of Gridiron Players in Saturdays Game

Wake Forest, Nov. 1.—A mammoth bonfire and mass meeting with addresses by members of the faculty was held on the campus last night following Wake Forest's "most notable victory" over Roanoke yesterday.

The Wake Forest team really fought. The team that defeated Roanoke Saturday fought harder than Wake Forest football team has in many a day.

There were more weeks till Thanksgiving and only two more games until the Davidson game in Charlotte. The Baptists will play the University of South Carolina in Columbia on Saturday and the North Carolina team at Raleigh the following Saturday and then the big Thanksgiving event at Charlotte.

The Wake Forest team in its triumph in the State beyond any doubt. They played A. and M. and Washington and Lee, probably two of the strongest and heaviest eleven in the South and in these 120 minutes of play only one Wake Forest player was hurt in the game.

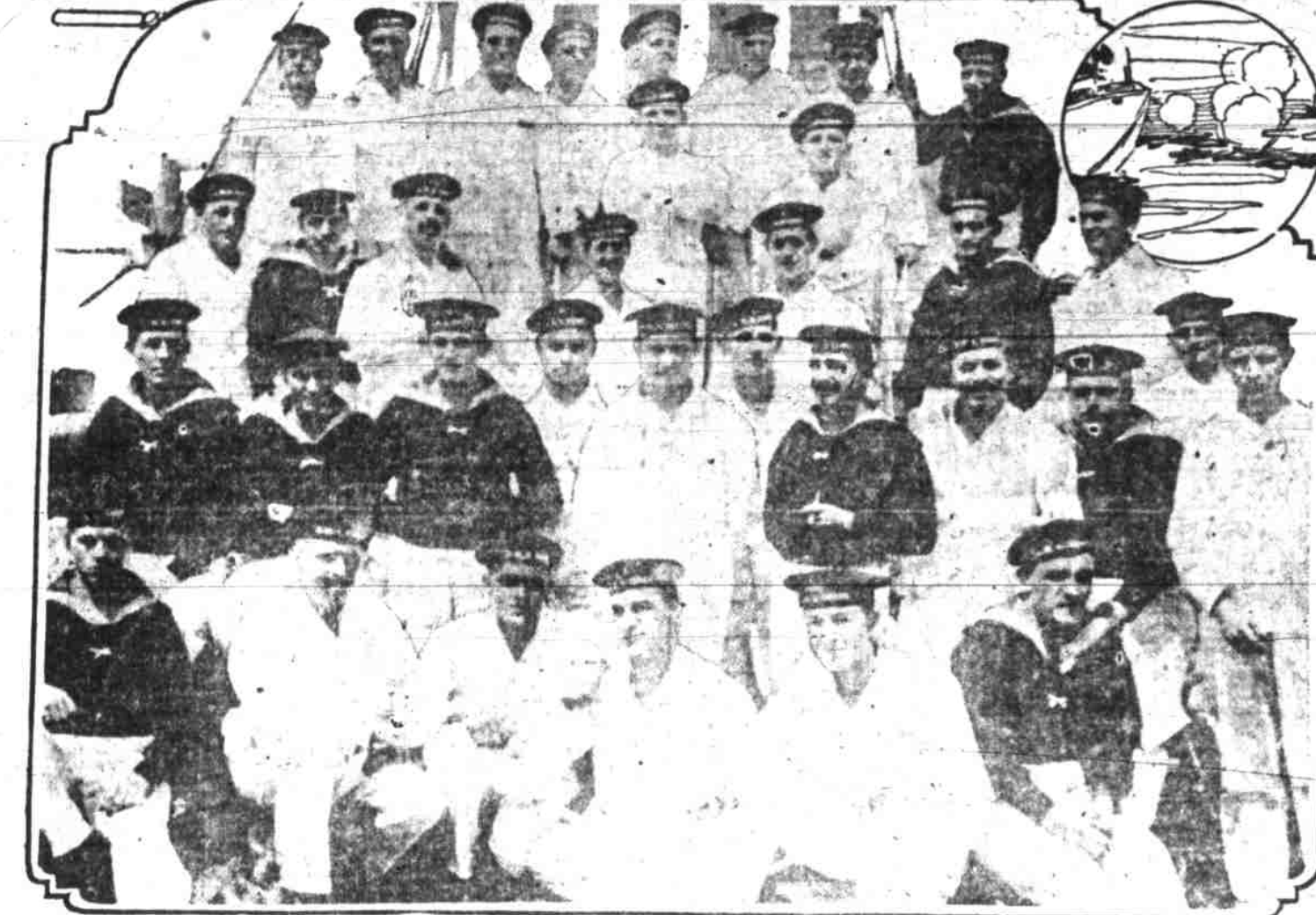
