Washington, D. C., Nov. 13.—Enormous growth of the United States during the last half-century was shown in a report today by the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce.

"In the same period," continued the report, "the approximate population has grown from 23,000,000 to 100,000,000, and the per capita value of exports from \$18.94 to \$23.27.

Evidences of improved social conditions are also found. For example, 19,000,000 children now are enrolled in public schools and about 200,000 students in higher institutions of learning.
