NEW PLANS FOR CHILDREN. WORK.

To Be Followed on All Redpath Chau tauquas This Season.

Dr. W. A. Colledge, director of the Educational Department of the Redpath Chautauquas, announces a change which is to be made in the children's work during the present season. A method has been adopted for presenting stories, folk dancing and games to children in a more systematic manner.

On the first day the young women in charge of this work at each Chautauqua will tell Indian folk tales and teach the children a few of the simple folk dances of the Indians. On the second day there will be Russian folk tales and Russian folk dances; o.. the third day German folk tales and dances and on the fourth day Scandinavian folk tales and dances.

The children's workers will class be ready to give to the parents in each community two informal talks on such subjects as "The Place of the Story in the Education of a Child" and "The Value of the Play in the Moral Development of Children."

CAPT. GEO, W. LOGAN DEAD Commander of Battleship Nebraska Dies Following Operation.

Norfolk, Va., April 22.—Captain George Woods Logan, commander of the United States battleship Nebraska, died at the Naval Hospital, Ports-mouth, early today, following an oper-

ation for acute intestinal obstruction. Captain Logan was stricken on board ship at target practice on the Southern drill grounds several days ago, but his condition was not re-garded as serious until yesterday. He then was brought to the Naval Hos-pital in the hospital ship Solace and the operation was performed imme-diately after his arrival.

The body was sent to Washington tonight. Burial will be in Arlington

cemetery.

October 39, 1858, and entered Annap-olis September 3, 1883. He attained the rank of captain July 1, 1913.
