## HON. R. B. GLENN IS AFTER PROHIBITION

Urge Nation-Wide Measure And Predicts Its Passage by Congress Before Dec. 31

### MAKES STRONG ADDRESS

Heard By Big Assembly in Presbyterian Church When He Pleads for Obedience As Guiding Principle for Youth And Declares Character Biggest Personal Asset

Before December 31, 1916, Congress will have submitted to the States of the Union a constitutional amendment providing nation wide prohibition, ex Governor Robert B. Glenn, yesterday afternoon, told a large assembly in the First Presbyterian Church. Governor Glenn came back to this State at the invitation of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union of Raleigh and his address under the auspices of that organization yesterday was on the general subject "The Good Roads for Evil".

Coming home straight from Georgia, and despite the fact that he was worn from the trip, North Carolina's former governor demonstrated to the people who have before hung breathlessly on his words, that his old time eloquence and inspiring earnestness in the cause of temperance has not dwindled.

Many who listened without slightest impatience through an hour and a half of the address declared it as best.

The general giving of the leaders to the cause of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union in its fight for nationwide prohibition which took place at the close was a testimonial of the speaker's power.

The Governor's optimism was contagious. He has seen the prohibition wave sweep over the country in its march toward a silentuous nation. The recent temporary defeat of the forces of the amendment he took philosophical

ly. Prohibition is his ex-

periment but that does not strengthen his belief that with more than half of the territory of the United States dry, Congress will pass the amendment measure directly after elections are over.

His belief in the cause and an enthusiastic endorsement from his audience in the Presbyterian Church. When he submitted a resolution endorsing nation wide prohibition as a proposition, it received unanimous vote of approval.

Special music with Mrs. Horace Dowell soloist, featured the exercises. The music was a part of the program that preceded the address of Governor Glenn and the whole closed with a ringing chorus of patriotic "America".

The meeting opened with Dr. W. A. Withers of A and M College presiding.

With introduction or presentation of the speaker was blind and to the point. He realized that North Carolina's former governor who spent four years of his life as the active executive of the State in Raleigh, needed no enclosure here and said so.

Governor Glenn received the introduction with words of pleasure of love for North Carolina and Raleigh and straightforward began the text of his address that urged parents to instill the habit of obedience into the hearts of their children and established character as the highest asset of manhood or womanhood.

The great remedy for evil day, Governor Glenn said, is not preparedness against outside enemies, though that is important; it is character building, that is, the development of the youth into those principles of living that will stand out for truth and power and righteousness against sin and vice and crime. And with the character of boys and girls of the State known, he ventured to prophesy the future of the State. The first lesson he learned is obedience and he severely took to task those parents who neglect this in the training of their children. When the child is envious Governor Glenn had a remedy, a scoundrel or chimney corner with the gentle even administration of lucky carded and snuffless tea. He had no patience with whining mothers.

"My motto is health and growth and I now weigh 220," he declared, while the audience tittered. Then the speaker told of his pitching record when for five years he tossed the ball in North Carolina while Washington Wilson lay down a position in left field.

Again he commented that for my wife, I wouldn't have been here to-day," and he told about being at Miami City where he saw a white dress woman approaching decked out in all of fashion's latest cuts, pushing before her a beautiful baby carriage.

"But I had nothing against the people," Governor Glenn added.

TALKS TO THE MEN.

On course, the men were pleased. It was a joke on the women. But their pleasure was short lived. He turned his attention to the male part of the audience.

But of all the contemptible old rascals I ever knew in the wide world, the worst is you old sinners who make excuses to get up street, or to the lodge or the office and let your wife tend to the children.

"Men," he cried, "stay at home with your wife and babies, stay at home where you belong," and he urged more companionship, more evidences of love, more expressions of affection.

## GREENVILLE DINES ITS FIRE LADDIES

### Hope Fire Company Gets Big Dinner In East Carolina Training School

(Special to the News and Observer)

Greenville, April 2.—In honor of the Hope Fire Company of Greenville a big dinner was given at the East Carolina Teachers' Training School yesterday evening, April 1, the anniversary of the fire which partially destroyed the dining hall and kitchen of the school.

East of the Mouse the night was calm. The encamp in the region of Dogwood and Vaux made no new attack.

In the Waccas the artillery activity was feeble.

There was no event of importance in the course of the night on the entire front.

The official statement on those operations issued tonight reads:

"Between the Somme and the Oise our artillery was particularly active in the region of Parvillers, Empoerier and Lassay, where German batteries were shattered by our fire."

"West of the Mouse the Germans launched several powerful attacks on a corner of the Avocourt wood. All the assaults were repulsed by our barrier fire and the machine guns."

"To the east of the Mouse the action was very spirited throughout the day in the region of Dogwood and Vaux. The Germans after a bombardment of the Avocourt wood, which penetrated Chalotte wood, but our counter attacks delivered immediately drove them back in the northern part of the wood. South of Vaux our line runs along the immediate outskirts of the village, the last ruined houses of which we have evacuated."

The members of the fire company and their wives, some of the contractors and builders who rendered efficient service in helping the officials of the school to meet the emergencies caused by the fire, and all those who are in any way connected with the school but do not make their home in the school, were in the in guest.

An elegant dinner of five courses was served at six o'clock.

Prof. H. E. Austin, chairman of the committee on arrangements, acted as toastmaster. He paid a high tribute to men in general.
