NEW ORLEANS COTTON. New Orleans, Oct. 23.—The cotton market today showed renewed strength as the result of general buying, chiefly stimulated by predictions of trading operations that the price was on its way to 25 cents a pound. All months made new high levels, July reaching 19.25, the highest price ever written on the local contract books. Spot prices were lifted 44 points to 18.13 for middling, the highest price in nearly half a century.
