RED CROSS SEALS TO GO ON SALE SOON

According to Dr. I. B. McBrayer, executive secretary of the Red Cross Seal Commission of this State, every town in the State is expected to have Red Cross Christmas Seals on sale the day after Thanksgiving. He says he does not believe that there is a town in the State, regardless of its size, that has not some man or woman in it interested enough to put the seals on sale and act as manager, and it's just this man or woman he wants to hear from. It has been the smaller towns, he says, for the past two years that have won the pennants and prizes for the largest per capita sale of seals, even as was the case last year in our own State. Clarkston, with an estimated population of only 276, sold 2,850 seals, which was a per capita sale of 10.277.
