

UNCERTAINTIES DEPRESS COTTON

Yesterday's Fluctuations Very Nervous and Irregular. Heavy Decline Recorded

New York, Jan. 10.—Uncertainties of ocean freight and peace negotiations appeared to be attracting the attention of the cotton trade from southern spot advisors during today's trading, and fluctuations were very nervous and irregular. After selling at 18.64 early May rallied to 19.02, but broke to 18.42 in the late trading and closed at 18.47, with the general late closing feverish and irregular at a net decline of 38 to 42 points.

STEADY PRESSURE FEATURES STOCKS

Of Same General Character As That Which Has Been Exerted Since December

New York, Jan. 10.—Steady pressure of the same general character which has been exerted with more or less effect since last December was the outstanding feature of today's market. Active shares yielded 2 to 6 points, with declines of greater proportions in those of the less representative class.

WHEAT LOWER ON HOSTILITY NEWS

Disturbing Rumors of Warlike Activities On Atlantic Hurry Prices Sharply Down Grade

Chicago, Jan. 10.—Disturbing rumors of hostilities on the Atlantic hurried wheat prices today sharply down grade, loans on some transactions showing a loss of as much as 5 1/2 cents a bushel. Extreme weakness, however, proved brief. The close, although narrow, was at 18 1/4 for net decl. with May at 18 3/4@18 1/2, and July 17 1/2@17 1/4. Other leading April, low finished at a setback, corn 14 1/4@14 1/2, oats 12 1/4@12 1/2, and provisions 2 1/2@2 1/4.
