NEW YORK AMERICANS REMAIN ON THE PERCH

Chicago Sox on the Mend After a Losing Streak; Tigers Lose One and Break String After Eight Successive Victories; Resume of the Big League Games Last Week.

New York, July 6 .- The New York Nationals were ousted from first place today for the first time since May 16, Cincinnati's double victory over Pittsburg today giving the Reds a one-point advantage over the Giants. The New York Americans, who retained their leadership, made a season record of 101 hits last week but these sent only enough men across the plate to win six games of ten, a pace easily met by Chi-The New York Nationals won a game from Boston and lost two games out of three to Brooklyn. Philadelphia was a Giant victim three times, Barnes holding the Quakers to one hit, a homer by Cravath.

Corporal Terrian Gives Specific Reasons Why One Should Be Erected

Washington, July 4.-What Uncle Sam's fighters think of the plan to build a national victory memorial building here and use it for the permanent records and relics of the world war is expressed by Corporal Elmer Terrian, of Company M, 125th Infan-try, who was wounded seven times in the fighting around Chateau Thierry.

Corporal Terrian is now convalescing at the Walter Reed hospital here. He is the proud possessor of the Croix de Guerre, and has been recommended for the Distinguished Service Cross. Recently the soldiers, sailors and marines at Walter Reed hospital were

asked to express an opinion as to the victory memorial plan. All of them wrote "for it." But Corporal Terrian had a little more to say:

"First thing a Doughboy wants to do when he gets back home," he declared, "is to forget all about the scrapping. That's why a lot of people are saying they can't get the soldiers to talk about their experiences. He wants to forget their experiences. He wants to forget all about it as far as he is concerned but he wants a complete record of that war kept. Yes, sir, the Doughboy wants a record. He wants something his mother and his sister and his best

girl can go and study. "It's kind o' nice to think of a place you can visit and see just what every State and territory in the union did in this war. It's nice to think of a big auditorium that will seat 7,000 people, where military folks can hold their conventions and keep the traditions of this war. I'm for it, and I'm going to con-

Corporal Terrian won his Croix de Guerre for "conspicious bravery in crossing the German lines in broad daylight and bringing back much val-uable information." In the Chateau Thierry-Vesle fighting he was hit by seven machine gun bullets, sustaining
