

FATHER PUTS STOP TO WEDDING PLANS

Wilmington Girl Leaves From Home With Intended Husband; Police Interfere

Wilson, July 16.—The adage: "the course of true love never runs smooth," was again verified last evening. Miss Ethel Clements, of Wilmington, N. C., and Mr. William House, of Wilmington, Del., left the home of the young lady ostensibly for the purpose of taking a stroll, but instead hired a chauffeur to take them to a small station on the A. C. L. road where they boarded a north-bound train. The father of the young woman, Mr. R. L. Clements, who is a pipe fitter in the Wilmington ship yards, and a deputy sheriff of New Hanover county, was put wise to the elopement. He got in touch with the police department at Goldsboro to be on the lookout for the absconders and the Goldsboro blue coats were on hand when the train rolled in at the union station but failed to locate the couple.

The would-be groom figured that Mr. Clements would be making an effort to stop him and when the train arrived in Goldsboro, he left the young woman behind and stepped off as if one of the passengers. However, he decided to get off at Wilson but ran into a whole covey of policemen. The young woman was taken to the home of the mayor and the young man put up a cash bond. The father came for the girl this morning and the young man is now charged with abduction.

Off To Alaska.
Saturday morning Miss Lotta Farmer, of this city, will start on her way for Fort Nome, Alaska, to spend a year with her brother, Capt. A. A. Farmer. She will be accompanied on the trip as far as Chicago by Mrs. Ashe Hines, who goes to visit relatives and friends. Miss Farmer will meet her brother and his wife at Vancouver Barracks, Washington State, and will embark on steamer from Puget Sound. With fair weather on the outside it will take twenty-two days to make the trip. Capt. Farmer

will be in command of Fort St. Michael and Fort Nome.

The organization will be effected through Wilson County Health Department.

ANNUAL BATH DAY NOT OBSERVED; MEXICANS WORRIED.

Mexico City, June 30, (By Mail).—With St. John's day come and gone again for another year the newspapers of the capital are unanimous in asking why this one time prominent feast is waning in popularity. The holiday occurs on June 24 and was early written into the customs of the Mexicans as a day for a bath and for a feast celebrating the nativity of St. John the Baptist.

This year, according to the newspaper, there was a marked decrease in the observance of the day. The bath houses which in former years did capacity business from early dawn until noon were not busy. The holiday spirit was lacking. In the Zocalo the principal place of the city, where on holidays booths are erected for the sale of food, drinks and trinkets, only a thin line of stalls marked the line for promenaders. The decadence of the festa was everywhere apparent.

GOLDSBORO PLANS COMMUNITY WORK

State Organizer Long Completes Survey of Town; County Auditor Named

Goldsboro, July 16.—Plans are under way for the betterment of the local War Camp Community Service. Mr. J. C. Long, successor to Mr. Omian Lang, State organizer, is in the city considering the prospects for this work. The survey he pronounced exceedingly favorable.

A building, centrally located with a ground floor entrance, has been secured and club work will begin immediately. This work will be under the supervision of Miss Ellen Lay, a recent graduate of St. Mary's School, Raleigh. Miss Lay will be the executive officer and assume all duties pertaining to Community Service work.

The purpose of this organization is not merely to render information and accommodation to sailors and soldiers and people in general, but also to afford an occasional educational program, consisting of community songs, choruses and entertainments of all varieties.

Start Membership Drive.
Tomorrow the annual membership drive of Goldsboro Charity Organization Society will begin at 10 o'clock in the morning. Co-operation and a greater membership are the purposes of this drive. At present, the membership totals only approximately six hundred and it is the desire of the society to increase this number to one thousand.

Bela Kun Pleads Self-Defense. (By The Associated Press.)
Paris July 15.—A note has been received from Bela Kun, the foreign minister of the Hungarian Soviet government, declaring that the Czechs and Rumanians violated the terms of the armistice with Hungary and that con-

sequently Hungarian forces were ordered to cross the boundaries fixed by the armistice.
The note claims that this order was issued in self-defense. The boundaries fixed by the armistice are so uncertain that the Supreme Council has referred the matter to a military commission for decision.

School Opens For Fatherless Girls.
Philadelphia, July 16.—The Charles E. Ellis College for the education of fatherless girls is now open. It is located in the beautiful Whitmarsh Valley, four miles north of the Chestnut Hill section of Philadelphia.
Mr. Ellis provided for the maintenance of the college, which he designed for girls what the Girard College does for boys, by endowing it with \$5,000,000. He died ten years ago. Girls who cannot be supported properly under their present living conditions will be given the opportunity for free education. More than 200 can be accommodated.
