CRUSHING BLOW Cincy Reds Administer Two Defeats And Are Now Leading 6 1-2 Games New York, Aug. 13 .- The pennant hopes of the New York Nationals received a crushing blow here today,

when Cincinnati won both games of a double-header and advanced its lead to 6 1-2 games in the National League championship race. The Reds won the first game, 4 to 3, and repeated in the second, 2 to 1.

The crowd that saw the two games has never been approached here before, outside of the world series games, and it exceeded most of those. Long before the first game was over the entire grand stand was sold out, while thousands stood in the aisles. Then the spacious bleachers were crowded, the entire crowd being estimated close to 40,000.


