

HEFLIN SPEAKS AT LAURINBURG EVENT

Alabama Congressman To Deliver Principal Address at Celebration

Laurinburg, Aug. 16.—Congressman J. Thos. Heflin of Alabama will be the speaker of the day at Laurinburg Friday, August 29, when Scotland county will celebrate the return of her soldiers from France. Congressman Lee D. Robinson, of Wadesboro and representative from the Seventh district, will accompany Mr. Heflin here from Washington for the celebration. Mr. Heflin is a national figure and as a speaker ranks among the best in America.

Indications are that Laurinburg's celebration for the service men will be a success in every way. Committees in charge of preparations are doing their work well and the people of town and county will work together to make this the greatest day in Laurinburg's history. Besides the speech by Mr. Heflin there will be many pleasing attractions to interest old and young. The Lecombe brass band of 28 pieces has been engaged to make music for the day. A professional decorating concern has been employed to dress the town up in gala attire one or two days previous to the celebration. There will be a big parade in the morning before the speaking, and a picnic dinner afterward for the soldiers.

An aeroplane from Pope Field, Camp Bragg, will come here for exhibition flights in the afternoon, if plans do not miscarry. There will also be a ball game in the afternoon by two out-of-town teams. Laurinburg will do her best to make the day pleasant for all who come here that day, and the indications are that a great crowd will attend.

The killing is said to have been due to West's failure to leave the premises when ordered and because of offensive language and an advance toward Northington with a knife.

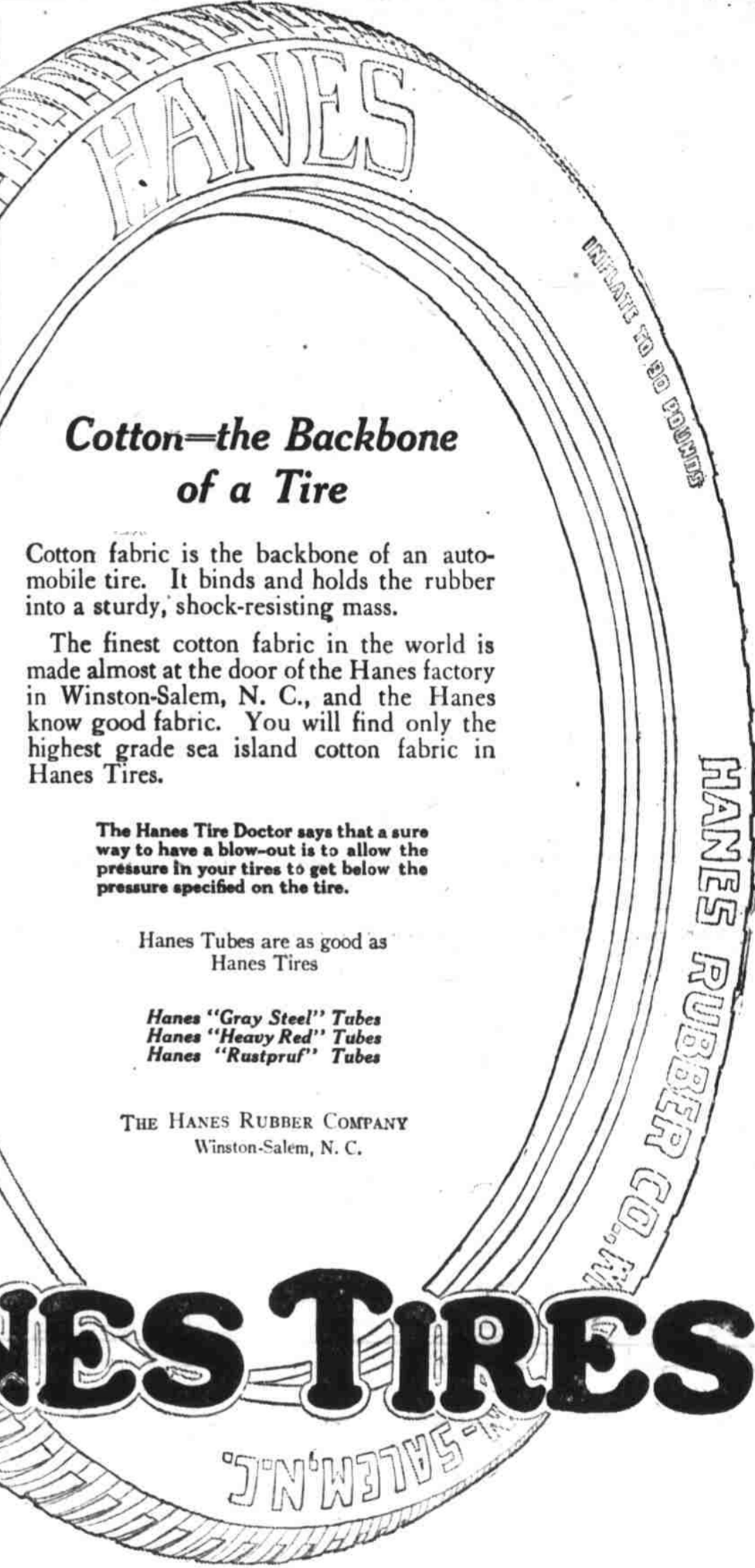
