Louis Jacoby, of Charlotte, Turns In Best Qualifying Card At Pittsburg

Pittsburg, Aug. 16.—Few favorites failed to score well enough today in the preliminary qualifying round of the national amateur golf championship at the Oakmont Country Club to be included in the list of those who will continue play Monday in the regular 36-hole medal play test for the 32 places in the first match play round.

Louis Jacoby, of Charlotte, N. C., returned the best card of the 136 starters, going out in 39 and in 37 for a 76. He was pressed by Francis Ouimet, of Woodlady, who celebrated his reunion with the amateur golfers by scoring a 77.

Charles (Chick) Evans, Jr., the champion, was one of those caught in the storm. He required 42 coming in but was out in 38 for an 80.

There was but one real upset. Perry Adair, of Atlanta, picked up his ball at the 17th when it would have been impossible for him to have scored under 90.

Players with 89 or better qualified, as the official result, tied for 64th place would continue in the play. There were 62 players with 88 or better and this allowed 13 players who scored 89 to get in.
