AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$15,000 FUNDING BONDS OF THE CITY OF RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA.

Whereas, by section 3 of the Act of the General Assembly of North Carolina ratified March 7, 1919, entitled "An Act to Amend Chapter 128 of the Public Laws of 1917, known as The Municipal Finance Act, 1917," all floating indebtedness outstanding at the time of ratification of said amendatory act, incurred by a municipality in good faith for necessary expenses thereof, was validated and authorized to be funded by issuing bonds under The Municipal Finance Act in the same manner and upon the same terms and conditions as are prescribed by The Municipal Finance Act for the issuance of bonds described in said act as funding bonds, namely, bonds issued to fund indebtedness incurred before March 7, 1917, not evidenced by bonds; and

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$25,000 OF BONDS OF THE CITY OF RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SEWERS.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Raleigh: Section 1. Pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act (chapter 128 of the Public Laws of 1917 of North Carolina, as amended), bonds of the City of Raleigh are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$25,000, for the purpose of enlarging the sewer system of the City of Raleigh by the construction of sanitary or surface drainage sewers.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,000 OF BONDS OF THE CITY OF RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Raleigh: Section 1. Pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 128 of the Public Laws of 1917 of North Carolina, as amended), bonds of the City of Raleigh are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$5,000 for the purpose of constructing curbs and gutters of concrete in the City of Raleigh.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$50,000 OF REFUNDING BONDS OF THE CITY OF RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Raleigh: Section 1. Pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 128 of the Public Laws of 1917 of North Carolina, as amended), bonds of the City of Raleigh are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$50,000, for the purpose of refunding a like amount of bonds of the City of Raleigh issued prior to the enactment of The Municipal Finance Act, viz.: \$25,000 five per cent Street Bonds dated July 1, 1909, and payable July 1, 1919, and \$25,000 five per cent Consolidated Debt Bonds dated January 1, 1907, and payable July 1, 1919. It is hereby determined as a fact after due investigation, that the bonds hereby authorized to be refunded were lawfully issued for necessary expenses of the City of Raleigh.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$100,000 OF BONDS OF THE CITY OF RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Raleigh: Section 1. Pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 128 of the Public Laws of 1917 of North Carolina, as amended), bonds of the City of Raleigh are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$100,000, for the purpose of refunding a like amount of bonds of the City of Raleigh issued prior to the enactment of The Municipal Finance Act, viz.: \$25,000 five per cent Street Bonds dated July 1, 1909, and payable July 1, 1919, and \$75,000 five per cent Consolidated Debt Bonds dated January 1, 1907, and payable July 1, 1919. It is hereby determined as a fact after due investigation, that the bonds hereby authorized to be refunded were lawfully issued for necessary expenses of the City of Raleigh.

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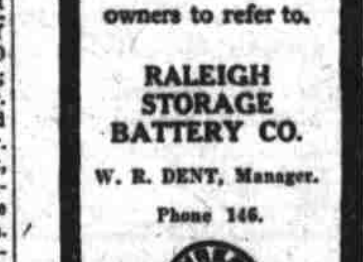

BIDS CLOSE SEPTEMBER 9, 1919, AT 8 O'CLOCK P. M., WATER WORKS AND SEWERAGE SYSTEMS, WILLIAMSTON, N. C.

Bids are invited until 8 o'clock p. m., September 9, 1919, on furnishing all material, work and appliances, and constructing complete water works and sewerage systems, for the Town of Williamston, N. C. The work comprises: Removing, resetting and reconnecting one old 7 1/2 H. P. engine, one new 12 1/2 H. P. unit valve, unafrow engine, for 125 H. P. steam. Two full front horizontal return tubular boilers, 150 H. P. each, for 125 H. P. pressure. Two 4 1/2-2 1/2-3-4-4 boiler feed pumps, and two injectors. One open style feed water heater to work with both boilers. Two single stage air compressors, 14" x 12", 470 cu. ft. per Min., belt driven, shaft extended for tight and loose pulleys. Two air lift pumping outfits, for pumping three wells 800 ft. deep, against a working pressure of 125 ft. Two underwriters centrifugal pumps, 500 gallons per minute, against 100 lbs. pressure. 1800 R. P. M. belt driven, tight and loose pulleys. All necessary belt, pulleys, shafting and piping. One reinforced concrete reservoir, 250,000 gallons capacity, about 65 ft. diameter, 12 ft. high, covered with slab. Alternative bids on steel reservoir of same dimensions. One steel water tank 75,000 gallons, on a steel tower 100 ft. from pipe to balcony. 6,985 linear ft. of 8" galvanized water pipe. 22,130 linear ft. of 4" cast iron water pipe, class B. 15,240 linear ft. of 6" cast iron water pipe, class B. 2,600 linear ft. of 10" cast iron water pipe, class B. 15-2" valves, 42-4" valves, 32-6" valves, 5" valves, 5-10" valves, 74 two way, 3 ft. bury, fire hydrants. 40,995 linear ft. 8" sewer pipe. 7,169 linear ft. 10" sewer pipe. 2,535 linear ft. 12" sewer pipe. 81 manholes. 12 single flush tanks (5" cyphon). 4 double alternating flush tanks. 31 flush manholes. 4 lamp houses.

Locate Site For Lake

Asheville, Aug. 28.-It has been discovered by forest service officials here that a lake to cover at least 25 acres of land can be built in the heart of the Pisgah National Forest area, a tract of land taking in 90,000 acres of virgin forests. The lake site is situated about two miles from the top of the mountain, the second highest peak east of the Rockies, and would be about one quarter of a mile from the automobile road leading from the Vanderbilt lodge to the glack beds, one of the most beautiful scenic drives in North Carolina. It is estimated, with the lay of the land, that a dam fifty feet long and fifteen feet high would stop enough water in Pisgah creek to flood at least 25 acres of bottom land which is at present a small plateau in the heart of the mountains. This would make a good sized lake about 6,000 feet about the sea level and would be the only large body of water in the Pisgah forest area.

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
