

SPRIGT DOWELL HEADS ALABAMA POLYTECHNIC

Dr. Sprigt Dowell, who has just been elected president of the Alabama Polytechnic Institute at Auburn, Alabama, is a son of Rev. and Mrs. George J. Dowell, of this city. He was born at Cary and at the age of eighteen graduated from Wake Forest College. After teaching two years at Zulander he went to Alabama to live and has resided in that State since. He has been connected with the public school system of Alabama for a good many years and had served several years as State Superintendent of Public Instruction when elected to the presidency of the Alabama Polytechnic. During his connection with the public school system he revised the Alabama school code. The Alabama Polytechnic has an enrollment of twelve hundred and Dr. Dowell's salary will be \$6,000.
