amounted to \$1,000,000,165 and exports \$798,136,458.

Exports to Great Britain for the fiscal year totaled \$2,151,336,428 and imports \$524,020,425; exports to France \$716,811,629 and imports \$172,022,935.

Exports to Italy \$398,065,795 and imports \$62,420,137; exports to Belgium \$117,012,688 and imports \$29,748,468; exports to Germany \$202,176,079 and imports \$45,058,975 and exports to Japan \$453,147,063 and imports \$527,220,867.

Exports to Argentina for the year amounted to \$20,420,000, exceeding those to any other Bouth American country, while imports from that republic totaled \$19,700,000. Exports to Brazil were \$8,556,600 and were exceeded by imports from that country by about \$1,500,000.
