Congress. "For instance, as illustrating the only power of the United States government in this matter, no State will be per mitted to use for physical training what the United States appropriates for seach-

ing illiterates.
"I have never felt that the whole burden of the education of the citizens of our country should be borne by the tates. The boys and girls of the poor State are just as much citizens of the United States and their possible usefulboys and girls of the rich and proserous State.


