He referred to the Legislature as "higher ground than the Supreme Court or the Corporation Commission" and insisted that the legislation was entirely justified "in order to right a wrong, unwittingly done by our predicessors." The Sen-ator from Cabarres was followed by Senators Hamilton, Burgwyn and Tay-lor, while Senator McCoin joined them in firing questions at their opponents.

Senators Erwin, Cates, DeLamey, Outlaw, Winborne, Dunlap and Patton all took the floor against the bill. Senator Winborne declared that he had studied it earefully and had reached the conclusion that it can be defended only if the former status of the Southern Power Company as a private cor-

Senator Oates read figures to show that under the original bill the Genersel Assembly would declare 132 dif-ferent rates "to be just and reason-able." This defect in the legislation was cured by an amendment offered by Senator Taylor, and accepted by Senator Long. The amendment strikes out the words "shall find such rates to be reasonable and just" and inserts in lieu thereof: "No action of the Corporation Commission shall in any way abrogate or impair the validity of any such contract in existence at the time of the ratification of this act."

Speakers frequently found themselves embarrassed by inability to answer questions propounded to them, and both forces held frequent conferences with occupants of the lobbies. After such a conference, Squator Delaney an-nounced in reply to a question that the Southern Power Company now charges the same rates in South Carolina that it is asking in North Carolina.
