

HONOR MEMORY OF GEORGE W. WATTS

Durham Business Houses and Factories Close During The Funeral Services

Durham, March 9.—Despite the rain which fell heavily after noon and continued until after 3 o'clock, great throngs of Durham people and visitors from out of the city attended the funeral of George W. Watts, Durham capitalist, who died Monday morning, held at his home on Dook street at 3 p. m. today. Practically every factory and every place of business in Durham closed out of respect to the memory of the deceased and to allow employees to attend.

Services began at the home at 3 o'clock promptly. Dr. David H. Seales of the First Presbyterian church read the scripture, Dr. W. W. Moore, of Union Seminary, Richmond, offered the prayer, and Dr. E. B. Layburn, of Home, Ga., made a short address. At 3:15 the drive to the cemetery started and Mr. Watts was laid at rest in the family plot in Maplewood cemetery a few minutes later. The services at the grave were simple, Dr. Seales offering a prayer for the interment. Crowds surrounded the beautiful, red granite and followed the cortege to the cemetery. The cemetery enclosure was filled with people. The floral offerings, large and beautiful, completely covered the family plot. Prominent visitors from all sections of the State were in attendance, as well as many from other sections of the country.

Attorney General Construes New Marriage License Statute

reassured as to their responsibility by a ruling from the Attorney General.

The highest burden is placed on county health officers in counties which have whole-time health departments. These health officers, under the law, are required to make examinations and furnish certificates when asked for, free of charge.

The ruling of the Attorney General was for the benefit of Representative Clem Wright, whose own county of Guilford has been bogged up in uncertainty about the procedure under the law, follows:

"The act is apparently drawn with full knowledge of our existing marriage law. As does that, it enforces its design by prohibition and penalties upon the officers and physicians who are to administer it, and not upon the parties to the marriage contract itself. Any marriage that, which has been solemnized since March 5th, the date on which the Bellamy act was ratified, is perfectly valid, though upon a license issued also since March 5th, without the certificates required by the act. In other words, a marriage when performed by a justice of the peace, or minister of the Gospel is valid though there may be an illegal license, or no license at all.

"The Bellamy act forbids the register of deeds to issue a license to a male applicant unless the application is accompanied by a certificate that he has no venereal disease, no tuberculosis in its infectious state, and that he has not been adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction an idiot, imbecile, or of unsound mind. The female applicant must present a certificate that she has no tuberculosis in its infectious state, and that she has not been adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be of unsound mind. The term 'idiot' in the statute in the what obscure, but we think it should be interpreted as applicable only to those persons, male and female, for whose benefit the license is issued. The register of deeds who issues the license without these two certificates having been presented to him, is declared guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to a fine or imprisonment. Any reputable, duly licensed physician, resident in the county in which the license is applied for may make the certificate. The county health officer of such county must examine the applicants on demand, and if he finds them fit, must give the certificate without charge. The physician who knowingly and wilfully makes any false statement in such certificate is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined or imprisoned.

Not Insurer of Truth
"It is asked, though, how can the physician certify that the applicant has never been judicially declared of unsound mind? Many cases may be suggested, in which it would be impossible for the applicant to satisfy the certifying physician as to this point beyond doubt. The certifying physician is not, however, an insurer of the truth of statements in the certificate. All the law requires of him is that he should satisfy his judgment in each particular case, with the individual features incident to it, by the ordinary means accessible to him. He commits no crime unless he wilfully and knowingly makes a false statement, or makes such false statement recklessly without belief, or any fair and just ground to believe, in its truth. A conscientious physician, and a large majority of them are, applying these general rules, will have little difficulty in dealing with particular cases.

New Marriage License Law
"The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:
"Section 1. No license to marry shall be issued by the register of deeds of any county to a male applicant therefor except upon the presentation by the said male applicant of a certificate of a physician, duly licensed to practice medicine within the county in which said certificate is presented, showing the nonexistence of any venereal disease, the nonexistence of tuberculosis in the infectious stage, and that the applicant has not been adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction, an idiot, imbecile, or of unsound mind. No license shall be issued to any female applicant who shall not present a certificate showing the nonexistence of tuberculosis in the infectious stage, and that she has not been adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be of unsound mind.

Section 2. Such certificate to be executed by any reputable physician licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the state and who shall reside within the county in which said certificate is presented, and who shall be certified by the county health officer of such county, whose duty it shall be to examine such applicants and issue such certificates without charge.

Section 3. Any register of deeds who issues a license to marry without the presentation of the certificate herein above provided for, or contrary to the provisions of the act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than \$200 or imprisoned 30 days, in the discretion of the court.

Section 4. All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

TRINITY DEFEATS STATE IN FINALE

Methodists Win Game Featured By Poor Goal Shooting To Tune of 34 To 26

Trinity last night defeated State College in the last game of the 1921 basketball season by a score of 34 to 26. Although the score was reasonably large, each team scored the bulk of its points in rapid succession and the game as a whole was marked by wretched goal shooting, both from the floor and from fouls.

Players on both sides missed easy shot after easy shot, while the shooting from fouls was the poorest seen on the Auditorium court this season. Crute, the regular performer for Trinity, was out of the game on account of sickness, and Simpson and Spikes were both miserable failures as substitutes. Simpson missed all of his six chances, while Spikes made only two out of seven. Grooms, who is usually reliable on free chances, was far from that state last night, making goal in only four out of thirteen opportunities.

However, although falling utterly on fouls, Simpson was easily the star of the game making five field goals, some of them difficult shots, and playing a highly aggressive game. He was followed closely in scoring by Richardson with four goals, and no member of the Trinity team made less than two.

Park, who was out of most of the game because of an accidental poke in the eye, and Williams, who replaced him, were the heavy scorers for State, each showing flashes of brilliant form. Williams located the basket four times and Park made good three shots. Ripple made three goals and gave an excellent performance.
