BUDGET BILL PASSES IN HOUSE: VOTE 344 TO 9

Some Minor Changes Made In Measure As Passed By Sen. ate: Conference

Washington, May 5.- The budget bill was passed today by the House, but with some changes as adopted by the Senate. It now goes to conference. The

vote was 344 to 9. The bill as passed by the Senate provided for creation of a budget bureau in the Treasury Department, with both its director and his assistant to be appointed by the President. The House retained the Senate mathed of agraphing both officials method of appointing both officials, but v ted to make the bureau inde-pendent of the Treasury Depart-

Provision is made for abolishment of Comptroller of the Treasury and creation in its place of a Comptroller general be selected by th President. The measure as approved by the Senate, provided for a seven year term for the Comptroller General and made him subject to removal by joint Congressional resolution, which requires the signature of the President. As passed by the House, howby concurrent resolution, which does

not require the President's signature. In voting the budget bill passed by the last Congress, President Wilson objected to the provision delegating to remove Comptroller General on the ground that it would be unsurpation of executive authority.

Within 25 days the reparations commission shall establish a special subommission to be called the committee on guarantees, to consist of representa-tives of the Allied powers, including a representative of the United States in the event of that government desiring to make an appointment. This com-mittee shall comprise not more than three representatives from the nation

funds assigned as security for paynent, such as German maritime land customs duties, and in particular all import and export duties, the levy of 26 per cent on the German exports and the proceeds of such direct and indirect taxes or any other funds as may be proposed by the German government and accepted by the committee in substitution therefor.

The 26 per cent levy on exports, less one per cent for sinking fund, it is provided shall be paid by the German covernment to the exporter. The committee is not authorized to

nterfere with the German administration.

Germany, it is stipulated, shall, sub-ject to the prior approval of the com mission, provide such material and labor as any allied power may require to wards the restoration of the devastated areas of that power or to enable any allied power to proceed with the restor-ation and development of its industrial and economic life. The value of such material and labor shall be determined
