tion to promote the project. E. B. Crow, of Raleigh, presided and introduced Dr. B. W. Kilgore who explained the meaning of the co-operative movement which is now sweeping the South. He told how growers and business men had prespered through cooperative marketing in California where the same principles of business organination as contained in the present applied 26 years ago. In contrasting conditions in California and North Carolina Dr. Kilgore stated that there is today a gap of a generation between North Carolina farms and towns. Because farmers are prosperous in California land values are high and the State is able to raise enough taxes to build concrete roads and schools and churches.

"If we do not get a fair price for agricultural products we can't build reads and make improvements and in a State like North Carolina all money comes from agriculture." Mr. Tomlinson said he was for co-operative marketing because it was a community pro position and not just a farmers' prob


